What is Construction Management?

Construction Management is a professional program that trains graduates to manage the business of construction.

Construction Managers coordinate all phases of the building process: estimating, scheduling, purchasing materials, creating contracts, and working with professionals to ensure the job gets done on time and within budget.

The MSUM CM program is the only one in Minnesota that is accredited by the American Council for Construction Education (ACCE). ACCE is recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) as the accrediting agency of four year baccalaureate degree programs in construction and it is the leading global advocate for quality construction education.
