This course explores the experience and challenges of aging from the perspective of the patient, the support system, the community, and the health care system. Factors and processes that are both contributors and barriers to successful aging and quality of life for older adults are identified. Various assessment tools and strategies for delivering evidence-based care will be considered that enhance quality of life for the older adult in both health and disease states.

2. Cite alterations in physiologic and psychosocial function for older adults, and identify those that which are most amenable to health promotion and nursing interventions.
3. Complete assessments using evidence-based evaluation tools to identify health care needs and problems in older adults.
4. Select evidence-based approaches for nursing care of the aging client.
5. Create intervention plans that promote optimal function and quality of life in the aging client through all stages of health and illness, including acute and chronic conditions.
6. Examine care models that promote safe health care for older adults.
7. Integrate leadership and communication techniques that facilitate interprofessional collaboration.
8. Discuss legal and ethical issues of the geriatric client including pain management, vulnerability, restraints and end of life issues.
9. Differentiate sources of financing for health, long term and home health care of the elderly.
