# **EECE 275: Effective Methods & Materials in Early Childhood Education**

This course explores developmentally appropriate practices for methods and materials in early childhood curriculum. Constructivist approaches to hands-on learning of children age 3-8 will be emphasized through analyzing materials and developing creative resources to use in an integrated curriculum.
