Writing Intensive Requirement: Students must complete two Writing Intensive (W) courses in the Middle and/or Outer Cluster of the Dragon Core program – at least one course must be at the 300 or 400 level. Students will take a Writing Intensive course (to be selected by the student) from Competency Areas 4, 5, 7, 8 or 10 plus Engl 387 or CMST 301 to complete this requirement.

Students must complete two additional W courses, one in the student's major or designated by the major at the 300 or 400 level and the other at the 200, 300 or 400 level, which may be designated by the major. Students will take Phil 312 and one other course to complete this requirement.

Admission to the School of Business

If you enroll at MSUM in the fall semester of 2001 or later, you must apply for Admission to the School of Business to enroll in all upper-level (300 or above) School of Business courses except ACCT 304, FINC 340, MGMT 360 and MKTG 310, which require completion of 44 semester hours to enroll. To be admitted, you must meet the following requirements and complete the Application for Admission:

1. You must have an overall GPA of 2.25, which includes all MSUM courses accepted in transfer.
2. You must have completed, or be currently enrolled in your 60th credit.
3. You must sign the School of Business Integrity Oath Acknowledgement.
4. You must have completed, or currently be enrolled in the following MSUM courses (or equivalent courses accepted in transfer):

ACCT 230 & 231	CSIS 104
ECON 202 & 204	ENGL 101
MATH 229 & 234	PSY 113 or SOC 110
CMST 100	

Students in the process of completing the course requirements for admission may apply for one-semester enrollment privileges to take upper-level School of Business courses. You must complete the Application for One-Semester Enrollment and obtain the approval of your academic advisor. This privilege is for only one term and will only be granted once.
