

Civil Protest

In many cases, campus protests such as marches, meetings, picketing and rallies will be peaceful and non-obstructive. Any protest should not be considered disrupted unless one or more of the following conditions exists as a result of the demonstration.

- **Interference** with the normal operations of the University
- **Prevention** of access to offices, buildings or other University facilities
- **Threat** of physical harm to persons or damage to University facilities

If any of these conditions exist, contact Campus Security (477-2449) they will be responsible for contacting and informing the President and the Vice President of Student Affairs. Depending on the nature of the protest, the appropriate procedures as determined by the President and/or the Vice President for student Affairs will be followed.

Note: The Director of Campus Security and his/her staff are authorized to call for police assistance without counsel from others if it is deemed to be of importance to the safety and welfare of the persons involved.
