An estimation of your remaining requirements include:

1. Completing the LASC: 4 Classes or 12 Credits estimated
2. Completing your Program Core: 43credits estimated
Total Credits required: 54
3. If you haven't completed your business classes: Principles of Management, Marketing and Accounting, you also must take those 9 credits.
4. All other university requirements are included in the plan : 40 credits of upper division, the 30 credits of residency, the 120 minimum credit requirement and the 2 Writing Intensive Course,
5. The "/" tag means that the class is only 8 weeks long either the first 8 weeks or the second 8 weeks.
