

NORMAL SUMMER SESSION

WILL COMMENCE JUNE 16 AND
WILL CONTINUE UNTIL
JULY 30

Arrangements are about completed for the summer session of the Moorhead State Normal school. Registration will take place on June 16th; class work will begin June 17th; and the session will close July 30th. Plans are made for as large and broad summer school work as was done by the school last summer. The arrangements of the dates indicated above will enable students to complete six weeks of work before the date set for the teachers' examinations. Double courses will be offered as there are demands for them and as the facilities of the school permit. The Model school will be in session so that candidates for graduation may carry forward their work in the training department. Since nearly all Normal school subjects will be offered, High school graduates may either begin or continue work in this session.

Arrangements with county superintendents will allow students completing subjects in the Normal school to receive credit on both first and second grade certificates.

The work in the Model school will be in charge of a faculty of five members and all grades of work will be offered. Due attention will be given to out door life as to study and play. School gardens, athletics, children's plays and games, tennis, basket ball, baseball and such games will be efficiently conducted. Courses in cooking and domestic science will be a part of the curriculum for this session. The work will be offered with the view of meeting the needs of the students who will attend the school. The pupils who attend the Model school will attend in the morning only. It is the purpose of those in charge of the Model school to meet the needs of individual pupils—both those who are behind in their work in the grades and those who are up in their work.

Rural school methods will be taught in an ungraded department as a feature of the Model school. This school will be run as a model rural school. Some of the subjects offered will be school sanitation and decoration, school management, children's plays and games, children's songs, penmanship and spelling, opening exercises, elementary agriculture, and children's literature.
