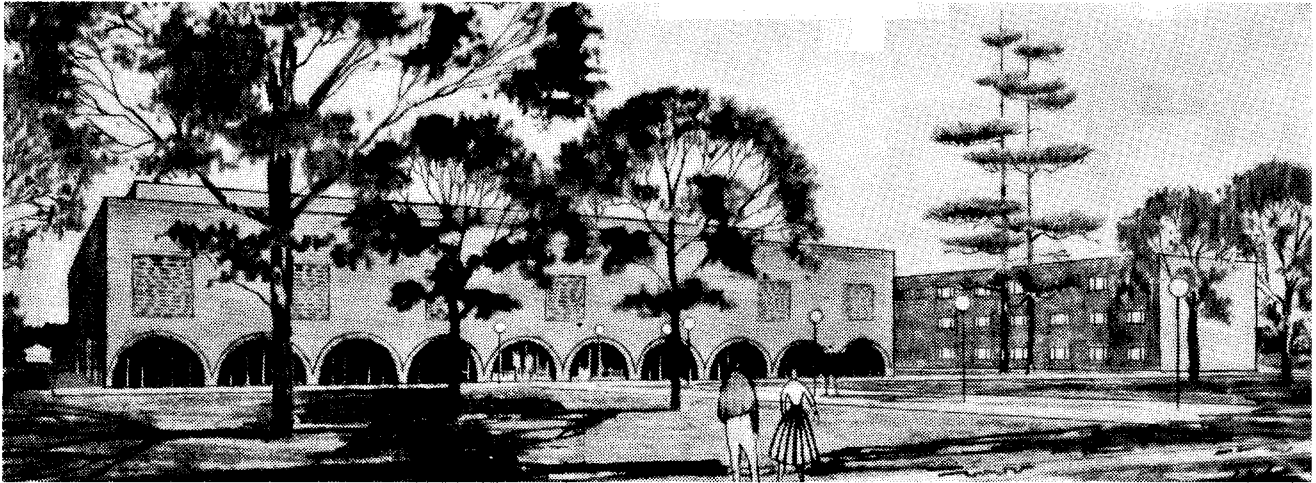

## Dedication of New MSC Library Set for May 10-13, in Four Day Ceremony

Livingston Lord Library, Moorhead State College's newly-completed library and audio-visual center, will be dedicated in a four-day ceremony on May 10-13.

The program has been designed to include academic as well as social activities. The dedication ceremony will culminate in a formal dedication banquet at 6:30 p. m., Saturday, May 13, at Dahl Hall.

The official dedicatory address at the banquet will be delivered by Mrs. Ada Comstock Notestein, nationally-known educator and former president of Radcliffe. Mrs. Notestein is the daughter of S. G. Comstock, "Father of MSC" and donor of the land on which the college was built. Her brother, George M. Comstock, served as resident director. Prom-

inent alumni and members of the family of Livingston C. Lord, first president of the college, have been invited to take part in the ceremony.

Dr. Norman DeWitt, chairman of the classics department at the University of Minnesota, will deliver the principal address at a student convocation at Weld Auditorium at 9 a. m., Friday, May 12. Mr. DeWitt's address will be entitled "Beyond Life," a borrowing from Milton, according to Mr. Dewitt.

The highlight speaker for the main convocation for faculty, students, alumni, friends of the college, and area educators on Friday evening has not been selected. Scheduled for 8 p. m., this convocation is planned as the official opening of the
