Evaluate an individual is respiration, phonation, resonance, and articulation relating to the modulation of voice with attention to a complete evaluation protocol including clinically appropriate assessment tools (e.g., history, acoustic and aerodynamic measures, perceptual rating, and imaging as indicated).
- 3. Diagnose voice etiologies and describe characteristics of vocal pathologies in verbal and/or written reporting (e.g., neuropathologic, functional, organic).
- 4. Demonstrate behaviors which reflect considerations for the needs of specific and culturally diverse populations.
- 5. Recommend evidence-based treatment approaches and interpret treatment procedures for voice disorders.
- 6. Detail the anatomical and physiological changes in patients with tracheostomies. Determine procedures for assessing communication needs and speaking valve selection.
- 7. Develop a clinically appropriate voice assessment protocol for alaryngeal voice, including stimulability, prosthesis options, and modality selection.
