## 2019-2020 Upper Class/Transfer Scholar’s Apprentice Scholarship Application

The Upper Class/Transfer Scholar’s Apprentice Scholarship is a \$10,000 award (\$5,000 per year for the **final two years** of a student’s attendance based on academic performance and GPA). Included is the opportunity to apprentice in an area of interest under a faculty member’s supervision. One student from each college will be selected (5 total awards).

This is a competitive scholarship and awards are made solely on the application materials received. When determining who is selected for this scholarship, consideration is given to:

- Quality of the student essay submitted in regard to both content and grammar;
- Strength of the student’s proposed apprentice project and value;
- Strength of the faculty/staff proposed apprentice project and value.

### Students must meet the following criteria:

- Current MSUM student in good standing; OR transfer student officially admitted for fall 2019 to MSUM;
- At the end of fall semester 2018, have completed 42-70 credits with a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA, and who have two years remaining to complete their bachelor’s degree (graduating Spring 2021);
- Applicants must be seeking their first undergraduate degree;
- Applicants must plan to enroll for a minimum of 12 MSUM credits hours per semester to receive this scholarship;
- Completion of five hours per week of apprenticeship is required for renewal.

### Required Documents (your application will not be considered if all documents are not submitted):

1. **MSUM Tenured Faculty/Staff:** A typed essay outlining the proposed apprentice activities and how the experience will benefit the applicant and the department. (Any proposal over 2 pages, double-spaced will NOT be considered.)
2. **Student:** A typed essay on, **“Why would you be interested in doing this project and what is its value to you?”** (Any proposal over 2 pages, double-spaced will NOT be considered.)
3. This application form.
